Use a mirror to find out where it is.



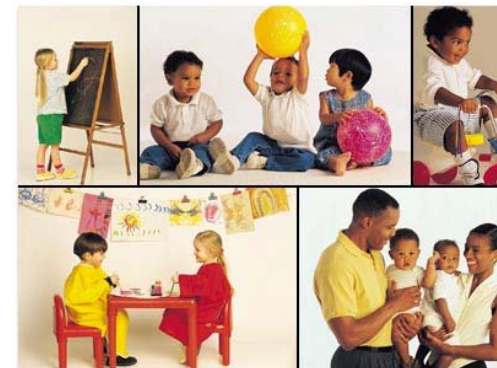

YOU ARE MAKING A DIFFERENCE

HIV/AIDS IS:

- a killer illness
- causing over a million children in South Africa to become orphans
- stopping children from affording to attend school
- leaving children without a home—no house and no parents
- making children very poor and hungry
- infecting children, who become very ill
- meaning that older relatives, grandparents, are finding it difficult to afford to look after the children



What ADRA can do in Esiphephelweni

- show those looking after the children how to keep them healthy
- provide clothing so the children can attend school
- make shelters for the children to live in or find foster parents
- pay for children to be treated by a nurse or doctor
- teach how not to catch AIDS
- support the families and provide warm bedding and clothing for the cold winter



GOAL

To help 500 children affected by HIV/AIDS by:

- giving 350 children uniforms so they can attend school
- training and helping 80 people to care for the children at home
- 200 children receiving warm blankets and bedding
- 250 babies benefiting from warm winter clothing
- starting a charity shop where the children can get second hand clothing for free
